

Field Trips

Field trips were taken as follows during the years 1925-1926:

1925. *February 22*, to New Lisbon, N. J. Thirty members and seven visitors; eighteen species observed.

1925. *April 10*, to Delaware City, Del. Twenty-one members; fifty-three species observed—Shoveller, Coot, Great Horned Owl and Mockingbird.

1925. *May 30*, to Cape May, N. J. Eighteen members and two visitors; seventy-three species observed—White-rumped Sandpiper and Short-billed Marsh Wren.

1926. *February 22*, to Brigantine Island, N. J. Twenty-seven members and two visitors; thirty-three species observed—Short-eared Owl and Snow Bunting.

1926. *April 22*, to Taunton Lakes, N. J. Twenty members and four visitors; twenty-two species observed. This was a personally conducted tour of the New Jersey bogs by autotruck through the kindness of Joseph Evans.

1926. *May 31*, to Cape May, N. J. Sixteen members and five visitors; fifty-eight species observed—A Hummingbird's nest with young was found.
