# **BIRD STRIKES**

Keynote speaker Dr. Daniel Klem, the Sarkis Acopian Professor of Ornithology and Conservation Biology at Muhlenberg College, will address the critical issue of bird/window collisions. Dr. Klem has studied the threat that sheet glass and plastic pose to birds for 45 years and estimates that between 100 million and as many as one billion birds in the United States alone are killed annually by flying into windows. Dr. Klem will speak about international research efforts to prevent bird collisions and will join a panel of Temple University and regional experts to discuss local solutions and practical steps residents can take to protect area bird species and migratory birds.
