It may seem presumptuous to identify the late DR. STONE to *Cassinia* readers. Let us remind the younger readers, however, that he was not only a past-president of the D.V.O.C., the American Ornithologists' Union, and the American Society of Mammalogists, but was also Honorary Curator of Birds and a vice-president of the Academy of Natural Sciences here; a member of many other national and international scientific bodies; author of hundreds of technical works; and for nearly forty years the moving spirit behind this Club, and this journal of which he was the first editor in 1901.

RUSSELL FOWLER, a D.V.O.C. member, is President of the Audubon Society of South Jersey, and is an active and competent birder. To Russ goes much of the credit for maintaining surveillance of the local resident status of both the Cattle Egret and the Glossy Ibis.

CLARENCE STASZ, Fellow D.V.O.C., has been an active member since 1949. A scientist by training, he is a capable and meticulous bird student. The Christmas Count at the Brigantine Wildlife Refuge, which he inaugurated, has become one of the Club's major censuses.

PHILLIPS STREET, a Fellow and past-president of the Club, and active in many capacities, is the author of "Birds of the Pocono Plateau", and other papers. Phil is an Elective Member of the A.O.U. and has been an officer both of that organization and the Wilson Ornithological Society.

DR. GEORGE REYNARD has made a special hobby of taping bird songs. Several of his tapes are included in the 300 bird-song recording recently issued by Cornell. George is a Fellow of D.V.O.C. and is also a member of the A.O.U. and the Wilson Society.

*RICHARD MILLER is one of our Honorary Members and has been active since 1908! One of the best birders in the field, Dick has also contributed a number of papers to the literature, including the *Oologist* and *Cassinia*.

ROBERT HAINES is also a Fellow and a past-president of the Club. His ornithological interests include long-time membership in the A.O.U. (1924, a year following his joining D.V.O.C.), and the Wilson Society. *Cassinia* has published several of Bob's papers in the past.

DR. MAURICE BROWN, Curator of Hawk Mountain Sanctuary, author, and all-around naturalist, joined the D.V.O.C. in 1950 and was elected a Fellow in 1952. An Elective Member of the A.O.U., he is also associated with the Wilson Ornithological Society.
