

Edward S. Weyl



The Delaware Valley Ornithological Club regrets the passing of its twenty-third president, Edward S. Weyl, on November 18, 1994. An honorary member and fellow of the club, Ed was president from

1947 to 1949.

An attorney, Ed was active in the Boy Scouts and enjoyed taking youngsters out birding in his convertible. He was an excellent field birder and joined his friends Julian Potter, Norm MacDonald and Phil Livingston on many an outing.

At the DVOC's Centennial Banquet in 1990, Ed had the distinction of being the member of longest standing: He was elected to membership in 1927.

In the early 1990s, Ed moved to Columbia, South Carolina, where he had a 20th-floor apartment overlooking the campus of South Carolina University. In the winter 1992-1993 issue of the *Philadelphia Larus*, he accounted for his birding activities there, having received pleasure from an American Kestrel that had perched outside his window for almost a month.

Upon his death, Ed graciously remembered DVOC in his will. — Sandra L. Sherman
